What is a Page Summary?

• Short summary of a webpage

Ideally between 150-160 characters

Why do We Need Them?

- To generate click-through on:
 - Search engines
 - Listing pages on our site
- To increase our SEO (search engine optimization) so that users can more easily find our site





Do's and Don'ts



- Prioritize dates over other information
- Make a long list of keywords
- Make it too short, or too long
- 150-160 characters

- Draft a simple and **unique** description summarizing the entire page.
- Write full sentences
- Use the correct language for the audience (general public, scientists, etc.)





Examples of Don'ts

This page contains information on aging (Too generic, too short)

This event will be help at 2:30 PM to 3:00 pm on September 5th, 2024, at 5601 Fishers Lane, Rockville, MD, 20850. Parking will be made available on-site (Irrelevant or less important information is the main focus)

Aging, Alzheimer's, AD/ADRD, national institute on aging, health, research, scientists, post graduate, omics, gerontology, geriatrics, caregiver, assistance (Not a sentence, list of keywords)





Examples of Do's

The "Omics Data Resources: A Path to Interoperability" addresses creating an equitable, effective omics data ecosystem that improves Aging & AD/ADRD resources. (Full sentence)

The DAB will host "Heterogeneity and Successful Aging" to discuss how the determinants of prolonged health can be identified by investigating heterogeneity. (Written for the right audience)

The Division of Aging Biology answers frequently asked questions about Nathan Shock Centers NOFOs (RFA-AG-25-012 and RFA-AG-25-013). (Includes specific and unique keywords)
